Notes on Tuition Fees for Postgraduate Students following Taught and Research Masters Programmes

General

1. The 2009-2010 fee rates apply to all students who commence a new year or other period of study on or after 1 August 2009. Fees are subject to annual revision and are due in full at registration. The payment of fees is the responsibility of the student and, in the event of a student's sponsoring authority (if any) failing to make payment, the student will be held personally liable for payment. Annual programme and course fees cover matriculation, tuition and one diet of examination. They include an

element in respect of membership of University unions, sports facilities, and other student facilities and amenities. Matriculated students who are not required to pay an annual programme or course fee should contact the Students' Association about associate membership.

2. Students are advised that they should be certain of their fee status before registering. Further information and advice on fee status is available at <http://www.registry.ed.ac.uk/fees>
3. Information on the Graduate Discount Scheme which is available to alumni who have graduated with an undergraduate degree from the University of Edinburgh can be found at: <http://www.registry.ed.ac.uk/Fees>
4. A late matriculation fee of £60 will be charged to students who register after the due date without reasonable cause.
5. A fee of £40 is payable prior to first graduation for registration as a member of the General Council.
6. **Annual additional programme costs** may also be payable by postgraduate students as notified in their formal Letter of Admission. Rates vary according to the field of study. Please contact the appropriate College Postgraduate Office for further information.
7. No fees are payable in respect of periods of authorised interruption of studies of over 3 months duration.
8. In terms of Resolution of the University Court no. 7/1982, students in debt to the University may not be permitted to re-matriculate in future sessions, nor to graduate, if eligible to do so until the outstanding sum has been cleared. 9. Withdrawal from the University: At the discretion of the University, a refund of tuition fees may be made to students who withdraw from a programme with appropriate academic approval. Students who withdraw before 31 January will be liable for 60% of the annual tuition fees. If a student withdraws after this date, he/she will be liable for payment of the full session fees for the programme of studies and will not be entitled to a refund.

Annual Fees

10. Full-time candidates for the LLM, MSc, MTh, MMus and MBA pay one full-time annual fee. Full-time candidates for the MSW and Master of Counselling (Interpersonal Dialogue) pay two full-time annual fees. Full-time candidates for Diplomas pay one or two full-time annual fees depending on the prescribed full-time length of the course. Please note that, in accordance with University policy, there is no reduction in the full fee charged to candidates who exit from any of the above full-time programmes with a lesser award (eg Diploma).

11. Part-time Study for the Full Academic Session

Home/EU students will be charged 50% of the full-time fee applicable to their programme of study. Overseas students will be charged 50% of the full-time overseas fee applicable to their programme of study.

12. Part-time Students admitted to a single course, Certificate or Diploma

Part-time Students who are admitted to a single course, Certificate or Diploma will be charged proportionally to the appropriate MSc fee, calculated on the basis of the number of credits to be undertaken.

13. Students continuing study beyond the period for which annual fees are payable

Any candidate continuing study beyond the period for which annual fees are payable are required to pay an annual matriculation fee until the date of submission.

14. Visiting Students

Visiting students admitted to full-time study for one semester will be charged at a semester rate which is one half (50%) of the corresponding full-time rate.

15. Modular MBA

Annual tuition fees for the Modular MBA will be charged proportionate to the full-time MBA annual fee and calculated on the number of credits being taken in the current academic session.

16. **Medicine**

The pre and para Clinical subject areas are: Biomedical Sciences; Medical Microbiology; Pathology; Neuroscience (including the Centre for Neuroscience); the Clinical Biochemistry section of Reproductive & Developmental Sciences (including MSc by Research in Reproductive Biology); and the Medical Physics and Engineering section of Medical & Radiological Sciences.

17. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Anaesthesia Practice**

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £9,810 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £3,510 in Year 1 and Year 2 and £2,790 in Year 3.
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £9,340 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £3,340 in Year 1 and Year 2 and £2,660 in Year 3.
For 2007/08 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £8,820 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £3,150 in Year 1 and Year 2 and £2,520 in Year 3.

18. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Clinical Education**

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £7,250 over the three years of the programme.
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £6,850 over the three years of the programme.
For 2007/08 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £5,355 over the three years of the programme.

19. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Emerging and Neglected Infectious Diseases**

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £9,250 over the three years of the programme.
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £8,250 over the three years of the programme.

20. **MSc/Dip/Cert in International Animal Health**

MSc/Dip/Cert in Global Health: Non Communicable Diseases

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £9,250 over the three years of the programme
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £8,750 over the three years of the programme.
For 2007/08 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £7,800 over the three years of the programme.

21. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Health Informatics**

MSc /Dip/Cert in Health Information Governance

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £7,250 over the three years of the programme
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £6,850 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £2,290 in year 1 and £2280 in years 2 and 3.
In session 2009/10 students following a flexible study programme will be charged £405 per 10 credit module and £810 per 20 credit module.

22. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Neuroimaging for Research**

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £9,250 over the three years of the programme
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £8,750 over the three years of the programme.
For 2007/08 entrants, home and overseas fees for these programme will total £7,800 over the three years of the programme.
In session 2009/10 students following a flexible study programme will be charged £515 per 10 credit module and £1,030 per 20 credit module.

23. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Pain Management**

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £7,250 over the two years of the programme.
For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £6,850 over the two years of the programme.

24. **MSc/Dip/Cert in Surgical Sciences**

For 2009/10 entrants, fees for this programme will total £5,780 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £1,740 in year 1 and £2,020 in years 2 and 3.

For 2008/09 entrants, fees for this programme will total £4,650 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £1,400 in year 1 and £1,625 in years 2 and 3.
For 2007/08 entrants, fees for this programme will total £4,350 over the three years of the programme. Students will be charged £1,200 in year 1 and £1,575 in years 2 and 3

25. MSc/Dip/Cert in Forensic Medicine & Science

Fees for an individual course, paid on a course by course basis, are £400. Fees for the full Certificate (if 6 courses paid for in advance) is £2,000 and a further £2000 for the full Diploma (if 6 courses paid for in advance) and a further £2,400 for the MSc.

26. MSc/Dip/Cert in Transfusion, Transplantation and Tissue Banking

For 2009/10 entrants, the home/EU fee will be £4,850 and the overseas fee will be £14,750 over the three years of the programme.

For 2008/09 entrants, the home/EU fee will be £4,600 and the overseas fee will be £14,000 over the three years of the programme.

27. MSc/Dip/Cert in Translational Medicine

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £7,250 over the three years of the programme.

For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £6,850 over the three years of the programme.

For 2007/08 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £5,355 over the three years of the programme.

28. MSc/Dip in Equine Science

For 2009/10 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £8,250 over the three years of the programme.

For 2008/09 entrants, home and overseas fees for this programme will total £7,350 over the three years of the programme.

29. Postgraduate Dental Institute

Details of fees for students who commenced study prior to 1.8.2006 can be obtained from the Fees and Student Support Team, Scholarships and Student Finance Office, Registry.

30. Annual Revision of Fees

Fees are subject to annual revision and will be increased in line with increases in the University's costs. However, the University will do all it reasonably can to keep fee increases for students in their second and subsequent years of study broadly in line with inflationary increases in the University's costs.

Payment Arrangements
